

COMBATTING ONLINE CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION AND ABUSE

KERALA

An MoU was signed with a 3-pronged approach:

- Setting up of infrastructure and building capabilities of Kerala Cyberdome.
- Development of GRAPNEL (Darkweb Crawler Tool) and its associated training.
- · Hold awareness sessions at schools on cyber safety.



MAHARASHTRA

We are engaged in the training of Maharashtra Cyber police officials which entails Legal, Investigation, and Forensic aspects with the goal to equip **300 police officers** for swift and effective response to **Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM)**.





UTTAR PRADESH (U.P)

A partnership between UP Social Welfare Department and ICPF was established with the purpose of training the master trainers from **105 schools** across the state on cyber safety awareness.





TELANGANA

Following MoU initiation with the Women Safety Wing, Telangana Police, the officials were provided with training on **GRAPNEL** tool and investigation of crimes committed through cyber channels such as Facebook.

ICPF also partnered with Telangana's Society of Cyberabad Security Council and so far almost 500 IP addresses have been shared for the purpose of tracking CSAM offenders.

COCON 2022

COCON conference platform was utilised to unleash the laser focused approach of ICPF in its new avatar and sharing some of the best cyber safety practices.



NATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION (NHRC)

ICPF was invited for a consultative discussion with National Human Rights Commission during November on CSAM and ways to tackle it.
